- 2. The island Camp
  - WEATHER PERMITTING
  - Porta-potties located on the landside of the causeway
  - Tent/Overland only (no generators)

### 3. Upper Field Camp

- WEATHER PERMITTING
- Quiet and secluded
- Porta-potties just down hill on pond spill way
- Tent/Overland Only (no generators)
- Trail access only (do not pass house)

### 4. Finger Knoll Camp


- Split down the middle with traffic around perimeter
- Best camping along eastern tree line
- Porta-potties along main driveway
- Tent/Overland Only (no generators)

### 5. Twin Chimneys Camp

- RV's permitted along main drive only (limited space)
- Daytime generators ONLY
- Porta-potties along main driveway
- 6. Pine Camp Camp
  - Park vehicles across the driveway
  - Porta-potties along main driveway
  - Tent/Overland Only (no generators)

### 7. Front Field Camp

- All welcome, nice and grassy
- Overnight generators permitted
- Porta-potties along north tree line
- 8. Pavilion
- 9. RTV Course
- 10. Event Main Entrance
- 11. Teeter Totter




Tentative porta-potty locations (number for associated camp area)

  - Limited space, overflow goes to front field

  - Good camping along eastern tree line
  - Use perimeter for vehicular travel


### 1. Main Entrance

- The "Little George" Entrance
- Rovers and permitted campers only
- No haulers permitted
- Please contact <u>admin@roav.org</u> if you have a camper/RV bigger than 25ft in length. There is limited solid ground for these vehicles.
  Overflow will be in the front field (number 4 on map)
- 2. Hauler Entrance (and support vehicles) https://maps.app.goo.gl/M33ajVXEM5swoNmBA
  - Upon exiting road, turn immediately right into the field
  - Do NOT drive past the home on the right
  - Do NOT park along drive, park in the east, forward area of the field
- 3. Hauler Parking
- 4. Front Field camping (see camping map)
- 5. Front Field Cut Through
  - You can access the property with your Rover via a short trail at the northeast corner of the field



Chelsea Entrance

- 1. Pearl's Pond guided trail rides are geared toward people who are new to Rovers, off-roading and new to the property.
- 2. Trail levels will be "scenic" and "beginners"
  - Scenic Fields, hard pack dirt/gravel and wider trails
  - Beginner Can be completed in stock vehicles, but tighter trails and some easy hills/obstacles
- 3. Use main driveways to go onto Bridgeport Road and west to the Chelsea entrance
